One thing the llamas are great at is walking at your pace, so one of their new found skills is to walk alongside wheelchairs and electric buggy's, enabling disabled adults and children at Center Parcs to join in with the whole family on their llama experience....Pixie, our champion chair escort, is expert at sidestepping though gateways allowing room for the wheelchair to pass through whilst still maintaining a loose contact on his

lead so the person in the chair is able to do the whole trek unaided...he's such a star.

As usual, the llamas create quite an impression on their walking companions and the holidaymakers that have fallen in Llama llove on their trek in the forest always call at **Llama Karma Kafe** on the way home for an extra glimpse of their favourite llama and to buy one of our cuddly soft toy llamas as a memento.
